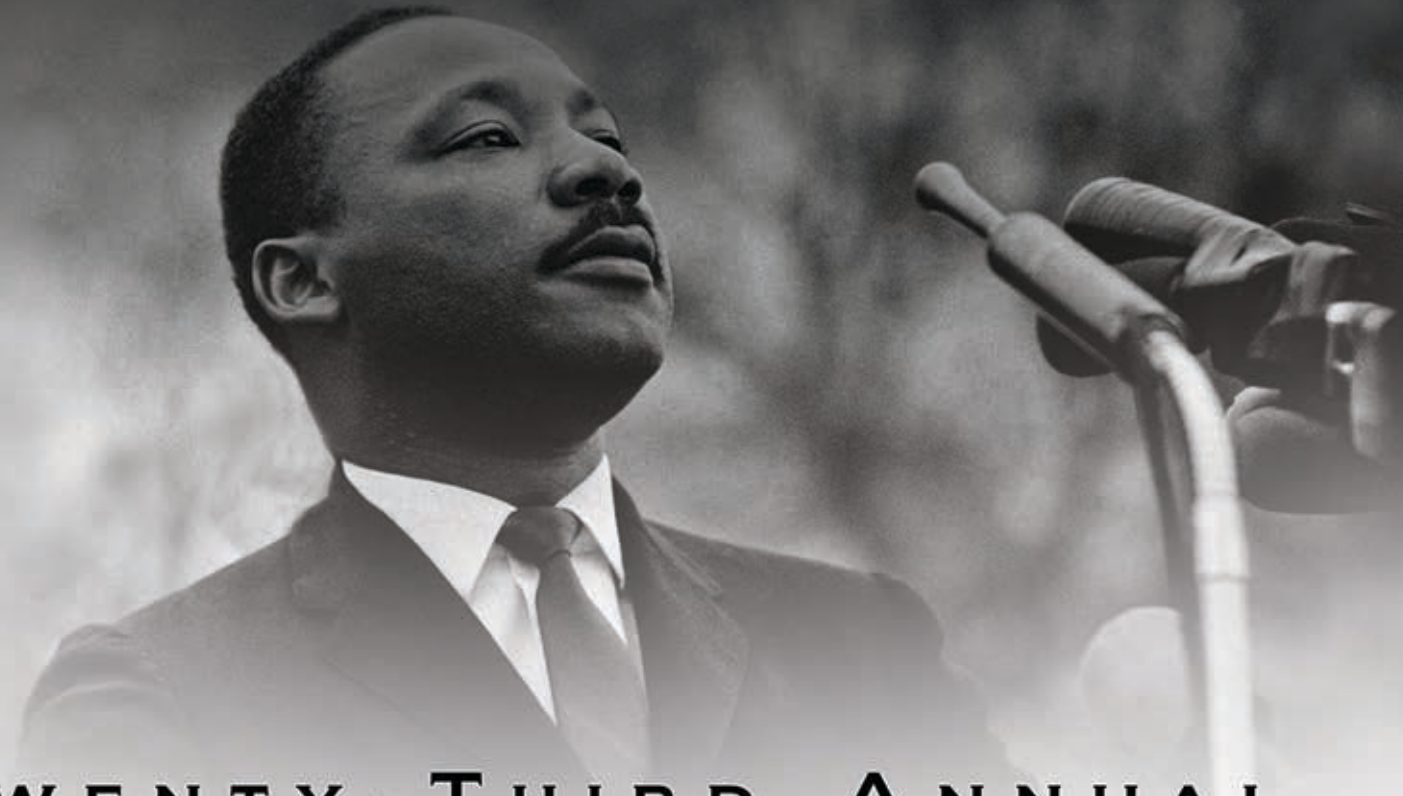

LT. GEN. ANTHONY COTTON

Lt. Gen. Anthony Cotton is Commander and President, Air University, Maxwell Air Force Base, Alabama. He provides full spectrum education, research and outreach at every level through professional military education, professional continuing education and academic degree granting. He leads the intellectual and leadership center of the U.S. Air Force, graduating more than 50,000 resident and 120,000 non-resident officers, enlisted and civilian personnel each year.

Additionally, he is responsible for officer commissioning through Officer Training School and the Reserve Officer Training Corps.

General Cotton entered the Air Force through the ROTC program in 1986 where he earned a bachelor's degree in political science from North Carolina State University in Raleigh. He has commanded at the squadron, group and wing levels. He served as Deputy Director of the Secretary and Chief of Staff to the Air Force Executive Action Group as Senior Military Assistant to the Under Secretary of Defense

for Intelligence and Deputy Director of the National Reconnaissance Office. He was also the Vice Commander and Commander of the 341st Missile Wing, Malmstrom AFB, Montana, and the Commander of the 45th Space Wing and Director of the Eastern Range, Patrick AFB, Florida.

Prior to his current assignment, General Cotton served as the Commander, Twentieth Air Force, Air Force Global Strike Command, Francis E. Warren Air Force Base, Wyoming.

The Twenty Third Annual **Martin Luther King, Jr. Memorial Breakfast** is dedicated to our beloved Brother, the late J. Garrick Hardy. Brother Hardy, a past president of Alpha Upsilon Lambda Chapter and Life Member of the fraternity, compiled an endless list of civic contributions during his lifetime. He organized the chapter's first annual benefit program, **The J. Garrick Hardy Cultural Arts Benefit Program**. It is with this same spirit of benevolence that Alpha Phi Alpha sponsors this annual affair, with the proceeds being channeled into the Montgomery community.

Since the first MLK Breakfast in 1997, 270 scholars have received \$207,200 in scholarships. In 2018, a total of \$15,200 was awarded to 19 recipients. Fourteen (14) were first time scholars that included 11 MLK Scholars, one Blackmon Scholar, one James Scholar, and one Price Scholar. In addition, there were 5 continuing MLK Scholars.

Rev. Brother John Alford

Brother Alford was initiated into the Beta Upsilon Chapter of Alpha Phi Alpha Fraternity, Inc. at Alabama State University. Brother Alford earned his Bachelor of Science Degree and Masters of Education Degree from Alabama State University. He continued his educational pursuits by obtaining a Bachelor of Theology Degree (magna Cum Laude) from Selma University and additional graduate studies at Auburn University, Samford University, and Athens College.

Brother Alford served as Program Planner, Program Evaluation Specialist, Manpower Specialist, Evaluation Specialist, Property and Supply Inventory Control Specialist, and Economic Development Specialist for the Montgomery Community Action Committee, Inc. (MCAC). Additionally, he served as a Public School Teacher in several local schools. Because of his unique skills, he served as a special consultant for the U.S. Department of Transportation, Justice, and Federal Highway Administration.



Brother Scott Johnson

Brother Johnson was initiated into the Beta Sigma Chapter of Alpha Phi Alpha Fraternity, Inc. at Southern University located in Baton Rouge, Louisiana. Legacy Award for Community Service

DR. WILLIE WELCH, III



Dr. Willie Welch, III, pastor of First Baptist Church, Greater Washington Park, was born on March 10, 1957 in Birmingham, Alabama. Educated in the Birmingham Public School system, he attended Booker T. Washington Junior College, Birmingham, where he received the Associate Degree in Business. He later matriculated at Birmingham Baptist Bible College and received the Bachelor of Arts Degree in Christian Education. He was subsequently awarded the Doctorate of Divinity from Birmingham Easonia Baptist Bible College.

Rev. Welch leads a congregation of approximately 500 people. Coming into the community with a vision to “Build a people; Build a building; Build a community”, he has been instrumental in redeveloping the community where the church is located. This once underserved community has seen revitalization with the addition of new and refurbished homes, a park, new businesses opened, and existing businesses flourishing. His influence is felt not only in the immediate community, but is constant in the city and state as he serves as an inspiration to many through his tireless work with numerous educational and civic organizations including (but not limited to): Montgomery AIDS Outreach; Montgomery Metro Ministers Conference; Alpha Phi Alpha Fraternity, Inc.; The United Way; Board of Governors – Capital City Club; Envision 2020; Leadership Montgomery Class XXIII; Montgomery Education Association Board; Montgomery County Board of Education Systems planning Board for New Schools; Board of Directors, Salvation Army; Leadership Alabama; and Westside Restoration, Inc. Rev. Welch was chosen 2012 River Region Volunteer of the Year and received the Lifetime Achievement Award. In 2013, he was chosen to represent Alabama as a community leader for Hyundai in Seoul, Korea.

With his gift for preaching and passion for teaching, Rev. Welch has been intimately involved in spreading the Word, both spoken and written. As such he has authored several books including: “Finishing My Course with Joy!”, 2006; “What Mean Ye These Stones”, 2007; “A Man and His Mountain: The History of First Baptist Church, Greater Washington Park”, 2008; Contributing author, “I’m Challenged: Daily Meditations and Challenges for Christian Living: 2009. He is currently working on a book of sermons.

FELIX E. JAMES



The Felix E. James Memorial Scholarship was established by Mrs. Dorothy James Pleasant in loving memory of her husband and our Brother, Dr. Felix E. James. Donations to this fund have been made by Alpha as well as family members and friends of Dr. James. Recently, memorial donations were made to the fund in memory of Dr. James' eldest son, Douglas James, an Alpha, who entered Omega Chapter in 2004.

Brother James, an alumnus of Alabama State University, received the B.S. degree in 1939. In 1953, he joined the faculty of Alabama State University after his tenure as principal of schools in Fayette and Huntsville, Alabama. During his 24 years of service to Alabama State, he served in various capacities, including Associate Registrar, Instructor of English, history and education courses, University Chaplain, Director of Religious Affairs and Assistant Professor of Philosophy and Religious Studies. He retired from Alabama State in 1977. Dr. James' love for God and education were priorities in his life. He also served as pastor of Hall Street Baptist Church for 38 years. Beginning in 2005, scholarships have been awarded to Alabama State University students enrolled in the College of Education.

HARRISON F. DESHIELDS, JR.



The late Brother Harrison F. DeShields, Jr. was an ardent supporter of young people who wanted to further their education beyond high school. As a result of his recruitment, retention, and financial efforts, a number of young men and women have been able to earn their undergraduate degrees. To continue his legacy of supporting promising young men and women, the Harrison F. DeShields, Jr. Graduate Scholarship was established by the DeShields Family and the Alpha Upsilon Lambda Chapter of Alpha Phi Alpha Fraternity.

Ashley Smith, University of Alabama law student and the first recipient of the DeShields Graduate Scholarship had this to say about Brother DeShields: "In order to be taught, one must first have a source from which to learn. Mr. DeShields became such a source, dedicating his life to education by first attaining an education and then transferring knowledge to those around him."

PERCY BLACKMON



The Percy L. Blackmon, Jr. Scholarship was established to further his life-long journey, as a public servant whose mission in life was to ensure that everyone he served was better off because of his involvement. His family established this scholarship to continue his legacy of improving the lives of young people through education. Having been a first generation college graduate, Bro. Blackmon endeavored to provide that same opportunity to many others, including his younger siblings, his children and youth in his community.

Bro. Blackmon, an alumnus of Alcorn State University, received the B.S. Degree in Mathematics in 1971. He later received the Masters in Public Administration Degree from Auburn University Montgomery. He continued his education in the United States Army, having retired as a Colonel after many years of enriching the lives of fellow soldiers.

Bro. Blackmon was first and foremost a man of God whose sole purpose in life was to serve his fellow man. His love of God and family were the driving forces in his life.

He deemed education the key to future success and wanted every young person to have the opportunity to reach his educational goals. The first Percy L. Blackmon, Jr. Scholarship was awarded in 2015 to a high school senior who was a first generation college student.

JUDGE CHARLES PRICE



The Judge Charles Price Scholarship was established by Alpha Upsilon Lambda Chapter Fraternity in recognition of Judge Price's unwavering commitment and service to the community and his fraternity, and in recognition of his distinguished leadership exemplified in his career spanning more than 30 years as Circuit Court Judge for the 15th Judicial Circuit, Montgomery, Alabama.

Judge Price is a graduate of Carver High School, Virginia Union University, and George Washington University School of Law. The lessons he learned as a young boy attending Sunday School in Hunter's Station, have shaped his values and guided his moral compass throughout his private life and career. The words of Luke 12:48: "For unto whomsoever much is given, of him shall be much required," have always guided him, counseled him and imbued him with a passion for and commitment to servant leadership. As he traveled the roads of Alabama in his capacity as Acting District Attorney, Escambia County, Alabama; served courageously as a trailblazer - one of the first African American Assistant Attorneys General in the country; advocated for the poor and disenfranchised while in the private practice of law; ensured justice was

blind and balanced as Municipal Judge, City of Montgomery, and as Circuit Judge; defended his country as a green beret before retiring as Lt. Colonel from the Active Reserve of the United States Army; as he supports the programs and values of Alpha Phi Alpha Fraternity; devotes his time to his family, his church, and his community, Judge Price never forgets those roots and works tirelessly to better the lives of others.

It is for that compassion and unwavering commitment to his community and to justice that the Montgomery County Commission unanimously voted in 2009 to rename the Montgomery County Courthouse the Phelps-Price Justice Center.

The scholarship is funded by Alpha Upsilon Lambda Chapter, Judge Price and private donations.

ALAGA Teriyaki Salmon

Ingredients:

1 lb.	Salmon fillet (with skin)
½ cup	Soy Sauce
¼ cup	Rice Vinegar
¼ cup	Rice Wine
½ cup	Alaga Cane Syrup
2 TBS	Vegetable Oil
Dash	Sesame Oil
4	Garlic Cloves
1/3 cup	Chopped Ginger Root
1/3 cup	Chopped Yellow Onion
1 TBS	Alaga Hot Sauce
	Crushed Red Pepper
	Sesame Seeds

Procedure:

1. Mix soy sauce, rice vinegar, and rice wine in a bowl or large measuring cup.
2. Add ¼ cup Alaga Cane Syrup. Mix well.
3. Add chopped ginger, onion, and garlic.
4. Add Alaga Hot Sauce.
5. Top off marinade with 2 TBS of vegetable oil and a dash of sesame oil.
6. Mix well, and pour over salmon fillet in a gallon re-sealable bag. Reserve 1/3 cup of the marinade.
7. Marinate salmon for 1 hour.
8. After 1 hour, add ¼ cup of Alaga Cane Syrup to the remaining 1/3 cup of marinade. Reduce the liquid over high heat until the marinade starts to thicken.
9. Remove salmon from the bag, and place skin-side down on a piece of foil.
10. Pour reduced marinade / syrup solution over the fish.
11. Garnish the salmon by sprinkling crushed red pepper and sesame seeds on top.
12. Grill on high heat on an outdoor grill for 10 – 12 minutes per pound of fish or until the salmon flakes with a fork.
Oven directions: bake at 375°F for 10 – 12 minutes or until fish flakes with a fork.
13. Use a spatula to slide cooked salmon off of the skin.
14. Enjoy! (DELICIOUS!!)
